Dear Minister,

School Libraries in the 21st Century

The School Library Association wants to highlight to you that the Libraries APPG report 'The Beating Heart of the School' (2014)¹ recommended that all children should have access to a school library. The Chair, Lord Tope, stated 'If every school has a well-resourced, properly staffed, fit for purpose library that is a key part of their strategies it will make a huge contribution to young people's educational attainment'. That same report went on to recommend that Ofsted includes libraries in their inspections and the Department for Education has a lead staff-member for school libraries. Two years on, and despite regular public comment and pressure, an ATL survey (2016)² shows more and more school libraries are closing.

The SLA urges the Minister not to let the valuable contribution that school libraries can make to the education of our children be cast aside when there is have a huge amount of literature showing just how much impact they can have when properly staffed and resourced.³
